The Richard Huck Legion Spirit Award

Nominations for the 2025 recipient of the Richard Huck Legion Spirit Award are now being accepted. **The nominating timeline will terminate on Thursday, January 23, 2025, at the conclusion of the Board of Directors Meeting**.

Commander Richard Huck was the only commander in the one hundred five-year history of Evanston American Legion Post 42 that transferred to Post Everlasting while in office. The board decided to create an award in his honor that best reflected his spirit, energy, and dedication to the principles of the American Legion.

The purpose of the award is to honor a Post or SAL member, who in the course the year(s) best demonstrated motivation, vitality, and dedication to the principles of the American Legion, specifically Veterans Affairs & amp; Rehabilitation, National Security, Americanism, and Children and Youth. These "Four Pillars" describe the heart and philosophy of the American Legion in their dedication to Veterans and service to the community, state, and nation.

The ideal recipient of the Richard Huck Legion Spirit Award is not necessarily an officer or holder of office in the Post or SAL, but rather any member who exhibits the principles of the American Legion by active participation in Post programs and activities in a manner that distinguished that individual above others.

The recipient of the Richard Huck Legion Spirit Award is selected by the nomination of any Post or SAL member. Nominations should be legible and as detailed as possible, broken into three sections:

- 1. Personal information, i.e.: Family life, education, employment, etc.
- 2. Military information, i.e.; branch of service, promotions, awards etc. & if SAL, history of the person who allows them to be SAL.
- 3. What he/she has done while a member of Post/Squadron 42

To be considered for the Huck Award. A single paragraph will not be sufficient.

The Nomination will be placed in a sealed envelope, clearly identified as "Huck Award Nomination," addressed to the Post Adjutant.

Following the nomination deadline, all envelopes will be given to the selection committee for consideration by vote. The selection committee will review the nominations and present their selection to the Board of Directors. The award presentation will be made in March at the annual corned beef dinner on Sunday, March16, 2025.

All nominations are due NLT the conclusion of the Board of Directors Meeting on Thursday, January 23, 2025.

Veteran Community Service By: James Farley

While the American Legion is known as a nationwide organization constantly supporting veteran's affairs at the national and state levels much of the positive effect of the organization is local. Post 42 members here in Evanston are working on several activities helping veterans in our community.

For example:

Using the proceeds earned at our family picnic in September, Post 42 was able to make a \$500 donation to the Midwest Veteran's Closet (MVC) in North Chicago. The MVC is collecting clothing, furniture, food and other household supplies to need veteran families in Lake and Cook County.

Members of the Post visited veteran patients at the Skokie Meadows assisted living facility in our neighborhood. The Post members hosted ten patients to popcorn and soft drinks while we showed the documentary film, "Heroes On Deck" about how specially fabricated ships were used to train WWII Navy fighter pilots on Lake Michigan. Everyone enjoyed learning about this interesting story.

Post 42 Legionnaires and Evanston VFW Post members visited a group of veteran patients at the Pearl on Foster Street. We met with facility patients who served in most of the military branches. The vets ranged in age from 50's to one Navy vet who is 102 years old! What on honor it was to talk with these men about their military experiences.

Two Successful Service Projects By: James Farley

In May of 2023 Eagle Scout candidate, Neil Stedman-Shaw, was looking for a project to complete earning the Eagle Scout rank. He approached Post 42 about if he might be able to perform a service project of significance. Well, he was successful in selling his idea to build a fence to enclose the Post storage area on the East face of the Legion building. He made the plan and collected the material to build a six-foot-tall fence surrounding the facility. And supervised the construction with the help of his Troop members and parents. Upon the completion of the fence we quickly noted that there was more work to do to secure and beautify the storage area. The ground inside the fence was uneven and many large weeds had grown up making the storage area less usable and was quite unsightly,
